The cross-subsidy refers to the amount special education expenses exceed state and federal special education aid. The adjusted net cross subsidy is calculated by subtracting the adjusted general revenue for special education from the gross cross subsidy. The special education gap is the amount the state is falling short of funding the statutory special education funding formula. School districts are forced to cover the gap with general education revenue.
